

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1. Foreword

The Centre of Children's Nurse Education (CCNE) is pleased to present its directory of programmes

for 2024. The CCNE is located in Children's Health Ireland (CHI). The CCNE develops and delivers

continuing education, training and professional development programmes across CHI (CHI at

Crumlin, Temple Street, Tallaght & Connolly) and nationally. The Vision of the CCNE is to lead

continuing education and continuous professional development to meet the ever-changing needs

of children and their families. The CCNE Strategic Plan (2023) presents the strategic objectives for the

Centre of Children's Nurse Education (CCNE) for the period of 2023-2028.

All relevant continuing professional education and training programmes for nurses, provided by

the CCNE, have NMBI Post Registration Category 1 Approval or are accredited with a higher-level

institution. Programmes are open to all registered nurses and other health care professionals who

care for children healthcare needs across the settings.

and Leading the Way A National Strategy for the Future of Children's Nursing in Ireland 2021-2031.

#### 2. Philosophy of the CCNE

Children's nursing exists within a rapidly changing healthcare setting, where Registered Nurses must deliver quality care that is appropriate, safe, effective and efficient, thereby enhancing the outcomes for the child and family. Nurses need to constantly develop their knowledge, skills, attitudes and values in order to respond to new, evolving and enhanced nursing practice across all children's healthcare settings. The CCNE aspires to facilitate nurses (and appropriate support staff as required) with this process, by providing programmes that are relevant, based on best evidence and responsive to current and emerging children's healthcare needs.

The CCNE acknowledges that every nurse is responsible for their own life-long learning and in the identification of their individual learning needs. Each nurse has a unique learning style and the CCNE aims to provide an environment that encourages intellectual curiosity, creativity and self-directed learning for each nurse enhanced by active participation in learning and flexible teaching methods.

The CCNE values the wealth of knowledge and experience, both personal and professional that nurses as adult learners bring to the education setting. It endeavours to promote collaborative learning with the educator facilitating the sharing of knowledge and skills thus advancing deeper learning and furthering the development of reflection, analysis, critical thinking, problem-solving and competence.

The CCNE believes that continuous evaluation of the effectiveness of programmes is an essential quality mechanism to ensure delivery of education/training programmes that will ultimately benefit both the child and their family.

- Formulate strategies for the promotion of breastfeeding in their workplace and community

- Evaluate the effectiveness of a breastfeed and recommend strategies for more effective breastfeeding
- Examine the challenges to breastfeeding an ill baby/child in a children's unit and construct plans of care for the breastfeeding and breastmilk feeding parent and ill baby/child

- Evaluate the effectiveness of expressing breastmilk and recommend strategies for more effective expression
- Describe the resources that will support the parent and baby/child in the community.

#### Caring for the Child with a LIFE-LIMITING CONDITION - Level B Programme

#### Aim of the Programme:

The aim of this clinical professional development (CPD) module programme is to provide the participants with opportunities to acquire additional knowledge, principles, experiences and values, supporting the nursing care required to meet the needs of the palliative child with a life-limiting condition and their families.

#### **Learning Outcomes:**

On completion of the programme, the participant will be able to:

- Examine the principles and philosophy of Children's Palliative Care, and its impact on the delivery of supportive and holistic care for a child with life-limiting conditions
- Analyse the stages of child development in relation to life-limiting conditions and the trajectory of the condition to the time of death
- Assess, plan, implement and evaluation therapeutic aspects of nursing care and treatment for children with life-limiting conditions from a palliative care perspective
- Embrace a palliative care approach to end of life care, grief and loss of the child with a lifelimiting condition and their families, including siblings
- Demonstrate leadership and communication skills within health and social care systems (statutory and voluntary) to provide quality child and family centered care
- Outline how policy, finance, and regulatory environments impact care for the child and family.
